

The Cottage Garden

Workers on the great English estates in the 16th and 17th centuries often tended their own small, profuse garden plots. Typically just large square beds separated by paths for maintenance, these "cottage gardens" contained favourite herbs, vegetables and flowers growing side by side in a relaxed and casual manner. Today an abundant variety of plants in an informal setting still characterize the overall style of a cottage garden. Other elements also include:

1. minimal or no turf;
2. pathways and patios of flagstone, old brick, gravel and mulch;
3. picket or wrought iron fencing, trellis, birdbaths, garden benches.

In our cottage garden, combinations of native and non-native perennials grow together with a few shrubs, grasses and annuals. Considerations for plant selection include an open, sunny location as well as diversity in colour, texture, form and structure of the plants themselves. This type of garden evolves and changes over time, as new seedlings from neighbouring properties sometimes establish themselves and/or as some plants perform better than others.

Other plants for a cottage garden (in addition to what is shown on the enclosed sketch plan):

SMALL: Pussy Toes, Carpathian Bellflower, Dwarf Iris, Thyme, Pasque Flower, Basket of Gold

MEDIUM: Blazing Star, Baby's Breath, Michaelmas Daisy, Blanket Flower, Blue Flax

TALL: Purple Fennel, Chocolate Snakeroot, Rattlesnake Master, Sea Holly Gazania, Sunflower

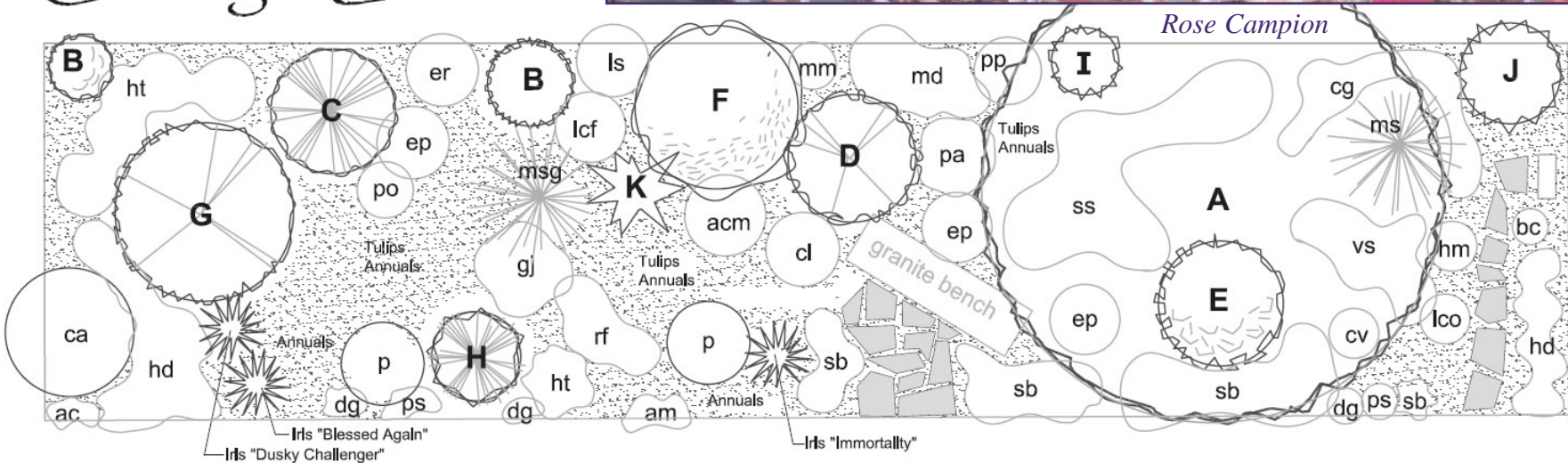
