SELF-ISOLATION OR QUARANTINE

On March 25, 2020 the Government of Canada invoked the Quarantine Act requiring travelers returning to Canada to enter a mandatory 14-day period of isolation, regardless of whether any symptoms of COVID-19 are present.

GATHERINGS OF 5 OR MORE PEOPLE ON PUBLIC PROPERTY

On March 28, 2020 the Ontario government issued a new emergency order to prohibit organized public events and social gatherings of more than five people, effective until further notice.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING (6 FEET FROM OTHERS)

Physical distancing of being two metres (6 feet) apart from another person is required to control the spread of COVID-19. Avoid crowds and practice physical distancing everywhere, including in open establishments, such as grocery stores or pharmacies.

NON-ESSENTIAL WORKPLACES OR BUSINESSES

To slow the spread of COVID-19, the Ontario government has ordered the immediate temporary closure of all non-essential workplaces or businesses. A full list of essential workplaces which are allowed to stay open is available here.

Closure of City facilities and park amenities

DO NOT

- X Use City-owned amenities (including playground structures, skateparks, etc.)
- X Play golf on City-owned courses is prohibited until further notice.
- X Gather with five or more in any public space
- X Use ATV's, e-bikes and motorized bikes on trails.

PERMISSABLE

- Walk-through and cycling use of City-owned trails while practicing physical distancing of 2 metres (6ft) from others
- **✓** Walk through use of City owned parks
- **✓** Walk through use of City owned golf courses
- Bicycles, motorized wheelchairs and scooters used for accessibility are allowed on City trails. Leashed dogs on trails are also permitted

Practicing physical distancing of remaining 6 ft or 2 metres from others is required at all times in public spaces.

The public is reminded to **STAY HOME** if they are not providing essential services to protect themselves and others and to only use 9-1-1 for emergencies.
