### NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

#### The New City of Brantford Official Plan – Envisioning Our City: 2051

PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION 17(17) AND SUBSECTION 26(4) OF THE *PLANNING ACT*, R.S.O. 1990, CHAPTER P.13 (as amended), TAKE NOTICE THAT A PUBLIC MEETING WILL BE HELD BY THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRANTFORD

#### PURPOSE AND LOCATION OF PUBLIC MEETING:

This virtual Public Meeting is a continuation of the Special Committee of the Whole – Community Development held on Thursday, November 19, 2020, regarding the proposed, new City of Brantford Official Plan – Envisioning Our City: 2051. At the meeting in November, the Committee heard a City staff presentation as well as public delegations in respect of the proposed plan, but did not make a decision regarding the adoption of the proposed plan. The Committee deferred their decision to a Special Committee of the Whole – Community Development meeting to be held on January 19, 2021. The Committee also identified three potential changes to be considered before Council makes its final decision in regard to the adoption of the new Official Plan. The potential changes are described below:

1. To amend Modified Policy Area 4 – Mohawk Lake/Greenwich Mohawk District Area in Section 6.9.i of the proposed Official Plan, to permit museums and cultural facilities as additional uses on the Mohawk-Greenwich lands; and
2. To change the designation of Earl Haig Park from “Lower Downtown” to “Parks and Public Open Space” on Schedule 5: Downtown Urban Growth Centre of the proposed Official Plan; and
3. To add a new Modified Policy Area in Section 6.9 and Schedule 10: Modified Policy Areas of the proposed Official Plan, to encourage the redevelopment of the motel properties along Colborne Street East between Wayne Gretzky Parkway and the east City limit.

Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, this Public Meeting will be held virtually via the Zoom platform. Members of the public wishing to speak at the meeting, either via Zoom or via telephone, will be required to register by 9:00 a.m. on January 19, 2021. #### PURPOSE AND EFFECT OF THE PROPOSED OFFICIAL PLAN:

The new Official Plan guides how and where the City of Brantford will grow and intensify to the year 2051. It will replace the current document with updated land use policy and schedules (maps) and includes the municipal boundary adjustment lands transferred to the City from the County of Brant in 2017. The land use designations, policy and schedules identify where various land uses can be located, such as residential, commercial, institutional, mixed-use, industrial employment lands, agricultural, parks, open space and protected natural areas, as well as the major infrastructure required to service the community. The new Official Plan will provide a framework for future zoning by-law regulations.

Upon approval, the new Official Plan will implement a recommended Settlement Area expansion and will conclude a provincial conformity exercise that ensures it conforms with the updated Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe, has regard for matters of provincial interest, and is consistent with the Provincial Policy Statement, 2020 under the *Planning Act*.

A hard copy is also available for public viewing at City Hall between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday, by contacting the Planning Department at 519-759-4150, ext. 5873 to schedule a viewing appointment.

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of Brantford on the proposed Official Plan, you must make a written request to the City Clerk at [clerks@brantford.ca](mailto:clerks@brantford.ca), or via mail to City Clerk, City of Brantford, 100 Wellington Square, P.O. If Council adopts the new Official Plan, it will then be sent to the Province of Ontario for review and approval. The Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing is the approval authority. Pursuant to Section 17(36.5) of the *Planning Act*, the Minister's decision is final as there is no appeal in respect of a decision of the approval authority if the approval authority is the Minister.
