

Recycling Program

PLASTIC

All food and beverage plastic* bottles, jugs, tubs and trays with the numbers 1 through 7 on the bottom, can be recycled. This includes clear plastic"clamshell" containers.



*There are exceptions: Please do not include foam plastic packaging (e.g. styrofoam), plastic bags, plastic wrap (e.g. bubble wrap), and "blisterpak" plastics (e.g. the rigid clear plastic packaging on toys and other products). Clean plastic grocery bags can be taken to the Brantford Food Bank, 1100 Clarence Street South.

PAPER

Household paper: Includes junk mail, writing and computer paper, flyers & envelopes (with windows removed), paper rolls, paper egg cartons, paper bags. NO: tissues, waxed paper or paper towels. Corrugated cardboard: Must be CLEAN and unwaxed. Remove all food residue from pizza boxes.

Tie in bundles no larger than 75 cm x 75 cm x 20 cm (30" x 30" x 8").

Newspapers, magazines & telephone directories: Includes catalogues, nanothack backs and hardsours backs with

paperback books and hardcover books with covers removed. Residents are encouraged to donate books to local charities.

Boxboard boxes: Includes shoe, cereal, tissue and detergent boxes. Remove liners and plastic windows, then flatten.



Beginning January 1, 2025, the Ontario Blue Box Program will undergo changes as Circular Materials takes over its management in an effort to standardize and enhance recycling services.

Bulk Item Pick Up

Residents cannot put furniture, appliances or other bulk items out for collection with their regular household garbage. A free pick up service is available once between the months of January to June, and once between the months of July to December.

Schedule your bulk item pick up online at brantford.ca/BulkPickup or by phoning 519-759-4150.

CONTAINERS

Cardboard tubes & cans: Frozen juice cans, coffee containers, potato chip containers, etc.

Food & beverage glass bottles & jars: Rinse and remove lids. Mason jars can be recycled. NO: drinking glasses, dishes, cups, crystal, window glass, light bulbs, glass pots & pans, mirrors, pottery or make-up jars.

Food & beverage metal cans: Rinse. Put loose lid inside can and pinch closed. NO: coat hangers, cooking pots or pans, utensils, batteries.

Food & beverage plastic bottles, jugs & clamshell containers, 1 through 7: NO: Rubbermaid products, caulking tubes, plastic or foam dishes, motor oil jugs, grocery bags, plastic wrap, styrofoam, toys, or other durable plastics. NOTE: Motor oil and antifreeze containers can be disposed of at the Mohawk Street Landfill site at no charge.

Aluminum foil, trays & pie plates:

Rinse to remove food and grease. **NO:** foil or trays with food scraps or grease, foil with paper or plastic lamination (chip bags, foil wrap from butter, blister foil from pill containers or cigarette wrappers).

Empty paint cans: Make sure paint cans are empty or contain no more than 6mm (1/4") of dried product. Remove lids. **NO:** cans with more than 6mm (1/4") of dried product, cans still containing liquid paint, cans larger than 4 litres (1 gallon) or plastic paint cans. All containers that have paint or other household hazardous waste can be taken to Household Hazardous Waste Day Events.

Milk/juice cartons & boxes: Must be clean, then flattened.

How we keep the city moving

What residents can expect during a snow event

Before the snow comes

In advance of a storm, City staff monitor weather conditions closely, pre-treat and anti-ice City roads, and communicate to residents that a snow event is expected using various City platforms. At this time, residents are asked to keep their vehicles and parked cars off roadways to make room for snow clearing crews.



While the snow is falling

The City of Brantford is responsible for maintaining and clearing nearly 1,400 lane kilometres of roadways. During a winter event, the City's Operational Services crews plow and salt routes in priority order. Visit **Brantford.ca/WinterControl** for more information.



After a Snowfall

Once a snow event ends, City crews focus on complete snow removal in the Business Improvement Area (BIA) downtown, as well as clearing sidewalks fronting City-owned properties and bike lanes. Clean-up of snow and ice build-up on major routes continues and once the snow stops falling, the City activates a 24 hour clock whereby service requests to Operational Services are temporarily paused while crews focus on clean-up efforts. Once a snow free 24-hour period transpires, Operational Services staff resume responding to individual concerns and service requests in priority order.

While the snow is falling

The City of Brantford is responsible for maintaining and clearing nearly 1,400 lane kilometres of roadways. During a winter event, the City's Operational Services crews plow and salt routes in priority order as outlined below:

Arterial Roads (Red Routes) Clearing starts at 5 cm, 6 hours after a snow event.

Collector Roads (Blue Routes)

Clearing starts at 8 cm, 12 hours after a snow event.

Local Roads (Green Routes)

Clearing starts at 10 cm, 24 hours after a snow event.

Windrow Clearing

Clearing starts at 10 cm, up to 48 hours after a snow event.



Acceptable Items

All Food Waste: baked goods (cakes, pies, muffins, cookies snack foods, etc.); breads, buns, pitas, etc.; coffee grounds and filters, tea bags and leaves; corn cobs and husks: dairy products: eggs and eggshells; food liquids including oils and grease (500 ml or less); frozen foods (all packaging removed): fruits and seeds: meat, poultry and fish (including bones); nuts; pasta, flour and grains; pet food (wet and dry) and bird seed; pumpkins (in pieces); salads and dressings; sauces and gravies; solid fats/grease (lard, butter and bacon fat); syrups, jams, jellies and food spreads such as peanut butter; vegetables and peelings.

Paper Fibre: paper bags (popcorn, sugar, potato and flour); paper muffin cups; paper plates and cups; paper takeout containers; paper towels, napkins and tissues; parchment paper; pizza boxes (broken down).

Other: cut flowers (all containers and decorations removed); house plants (with soil, containers and decorations removed), stem less than 1" (2.5cm) in diameter; shredded paper.

Free Compost

Beginning May 5th, free compost is available at the Mohawk Street Landfill Site, Monday through Saturday between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. Limit of two full garbage bags or equivalent per day, while quantities last.





Pedestrian Crossovers

Pedestrians have the right of way!

A pedestrian crossover (PXO) is a type of crossing where, by law, drivers are required to stop for pedestrians intending to cross the road. Drivers MUST allow pedestrians to cross the full width of the road before proceeding.

Waterwise Landscapes

To reduce summer water use, the City encourages residents to embrace waterwise landscaping.

This type of landscaping maximizes water absorption to help gardens withstand both wet and dry weather conditions. The use of specific plants, watering techniques and permeable



hardscapes can be used to create a variety of beautiful landscapes that require less water, less money and less maintenance than traditional lawns once established.

Waterwise gardens can survive almost entirely on rainwater using these planting techniques:



- Increase the ratio of plants to grass
- Use plants that are native, perennial, or drought-tolerant
- Use rain barrels where possible
- Use mulch (includes living mulch) to retain water and control weeds






